

China is one of the most affected countries by this problem. All of China's lakes and rivers are polluted in some degree.

CAUSES

- -Rain and rivers help carry garbage into oceans, which results in the growing number of seaweed.
- -Garbage from local residents, hotels in coastal areas and ships pollutes sea waters.
- -The residents living on ships produce some litter on a daily basis at harbors.
- -About one third of the industrial waste water and more than 90% of household sewage in China is released into rivers and lakes without being treated.
- -Factories fouling critical water sources are making goods consumed by people in the US and Europe.
- -Laws on the books are widely ignored.

CONSEQUENCES

- -320 million people in China without access to clean drinking water.
- -40% of China's surface water is considered polluted.
- -20% of drinking water in urban areas is contaminated.
- -278 Chinese cities do not have sewage treatment facilities.
- -60,000 people die each year from diarrhea, bladder and stomach cancer and other diseases.
- -217 billion yuan is the estimated cost of water pollution to China's economy every year.
- -Water consumed by people in China contains dangerous levels of **arsenic**, **fluorine** and **sulfates**.
- **-600 million** Chinese drink water contaminated with human or animal wastes.
- -20 million people drink well water contaminated.
