2.2. Description of the contents

The completion of a traineeship in companies also have several objectives. On the one hand, tries to bridge the student between the life experience of a student and the performance of a job in a company. On the other hand, it serves as a field of experience for the application of acquired knowledge and to observe reality as the application of such knowledge by professionals much more experience develops. The student has a tutor at the University which can go to any resolution or doubt of any problem arising. The tutor is in contact with those responsible for the company in which the student develops his traineeship. At the end of that period, the company issues an evaluation report of student performance, while the student has to write a report on their activity during practice. The University has a specialized department called Career Services Department that is responsible for the management and administration of external practices. The guardian of the student and the coordinator of the degree are in constant contact with the Department of Career Services to facilitate the implementation of the period of external practices.

3. EVALUATION SYSTEM

3.1. Grading system

The final grading system will be expressed numerically as follows:

- 0 - 4.9 Fail (SS)
- 5.0 - 6.9 Pass (AP)
- 7.0 - 8.9 Notable (NT)
- 9.0 - 10 Excellent (SB)

The mention of "academic honors" may be awarded to students who have obtained a grade equal to or greater than 9.0.

3.2. Evaluation Criteria

Modality Face-to-face; modality blended; modality distance.

To successfully pass any subject / subject, the student must pass the final exam in person. That is, in the final exam, a grade equal to or greater than 5 on a scale of 0-10 must be achieved, with 0 being the minimum grade and 10 the maximum.

3.3. Restrictions

Minimum qualification

To successfully pass any subject / subject, the student must pass the final exam in person. That is, in the final exam, a grade equal to or greater than 5 on a scale of 0-10 must be achieved, with 0 being the minimum grade and 10 the maximum.

Writing rules

Special attention will be paid in the written assignments, practices and projects, as well as in the exams both the presentation and the content, taking care of the grammatical and spelling aspects. Failure to comply with the acceptable minimums may result in points being deducted in said work.
