In both cases this is a requirement only for students who are non-native in these languages. 5. Photocopy of medical insurance valid in Spain			
Payment Methods	Paying students in the Integrated Programs would generally need to use the Flywire service to pay for their tuition (remember that exchange students are exempt). Paying students in the Hispanic Studies Program or in Spanish PLUS*, or who wish to contract housing with a local family or in one of our official Residences may need to pay by credit card or by bank transfer.
